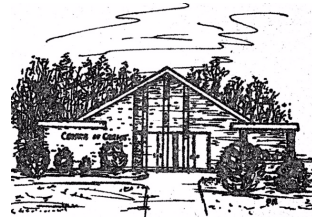

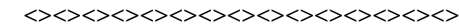

The apostle Paul tells husbands in Ephesians 5:25-28, "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish. So husbands ought to love their own wives as their own bodies; he who loves his wife loves himself."

He then concluded the section by admonishing the wives to respect their husbands. - Ephesians 5:33 "Nevertheless let each one of you in particular so love his own wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband."

Paul told the Roman Christians in Romans 13:10, "Love does no harm to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfillment of the law."

May we strive to make our marriage what God intended for it to be.
