On Facebook, in August, I saw a post (or meme) by Carey Nieuwhof on reasons church goers don't attend as they once did. Consider some of those points and give some attention to them.

1) **There is greater affluence**. This pertains to having more money and with that money believing the Lord has blessed the one who has it, so they must be living their life in the right way. Many in the Jewish community in Jesus' was also mistaken in thinking this way.

2) More attention to their children & their activities. What parent hasn't struggled with the "balance" between keeping the kids in church (so to speak) and allowing each to participate in school activities? While perhaps we all have struggled, it's only the parent who sets the tone for what is a right activity to be engaged in; too often, however, it's the children who set the tone.

3) More traveling. Traveling is a blessing that each of us like to pursue, but too many travel and miss (on purpose) meeting with the saints. They do this because some effort has to be expended to find a church location and then drive to it. If out of the way, "Well, I guess we can miss today because it's too far to drive." All the while the irony is missing on that they drove hundreds of miles to get where they did!

4) Cultural disappearance of guilt evaporating. There was a day when feeling guilty would prevent a person from doing a certain thing or engaging in a certain behavior. For some, this is still the case, but for many more this is not so, we are deluded with television programing, radio programing, movie watching that says, in effect, "do what you want" because only hypocrites judge. "If I am being judged by a hypocrite who does not feel guilty, then why should I?"

5) Self-directed spirituality. I remember watching Dan Rather interview Willie Nelson, asking him whether he is religious or not. Willie said he was not, but that he was spiritual. What does that mean?! It means there is more to life than the material realm, but "I don't want what the Father of Heaven is offering, so I accept a dumb-downed approach and call it spiritual, new-age, perhaps, and feel convinced I am worthy of whatever aood there in the after-life.

6) No direct benefit in their lives. You have heard this before; it goes like this: "I did not get anything out of services today. In fact, I seem to never get anything from the services of the church!" There is an easy and proper reply to this, one that is obvious to many. This view is clear indication of what one desires, which is, not to worship the Lord (emphasis on Him), but to be entertained (emphasis on me).

7) Valuing attendance over engagement. I had to think on this for an extra moment, but it shortly came to me. This reflects the person who is at the services of the church, but not engaged in worship. It reflects an "I am here, ain't I!" attitude, said with a tone one can't fail to understand what is being said.

8) Massive cultural shift. We live in a society that does not know what is right, does not know the Lord, but does only what one wants. Many bring this with them into a church context. Saints who think along these lines are major contributors to the death of the local congregation because they themselves have dies spiritually, they want more of the world than they want of the Lord.
