For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned," (Matthew 12:34-35, 37).

There is no such thing as a "slip of the tongue," for the tongue speaks only what it is commanded to speak. "If any man among you seem to be religious, and bridleth not his tongue, but deceiveth his own heart, this man's religion is vain," (James 1:26). "Even so the tongue is a little member, and boasteth great things. Behold, how great a matter a little fire kindleth!... Therewith bless we God, even the Father, and therewith curse we men, which are made after the similitude of God. Out of the same mouth proceedeth blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not so to be," (James 3:5,9-10).
