Memorial Day

Memorial Day is a day of remembrance for those who have died in our nation's service. It traces its roots back to 1868 when General John Logan, of the Grand Army of the Republic, declared May 30th as a day of remembrance. Flowers were placed on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery.

The day was originally called "Decoration Day." It is sometimes called "Poppy Day" because artificial red poppies, which were made by disabled veterans, are sold. The money is used to benefit servicemen in need. In December of 2000, Congress passed a resolution which asks all Americans "to voluntarily and informally observe a Moment of Remembrance and respect," at 3:00 local time.

Tomorrow is the official Memorial Holiday. Many people see it as just a 3-day weekend, or the unofficial start to summer. But for those who have lost someone because of war or military action, it means much more than a day off. In fact, every American ought to recognize this day in honor of those who spilled their blood to make America what she is today--free, strong, and a nation worth fighting for.

Because men have died for this country, we have the right to preach God's word freely. We have the right to live at peace in our own homes. We have the right to pursue peace, prosperity and happiness. Memorial Day is a time when we remember a sobering fact: "The Cost of Freedom is Blood."

Once a year in our country we observe Memorial Day. But for the Christian, every week is a celebration of the Memorial of Christ. Jesus fought the armies of Hell so that we can be set free. For the Christian, every Sunday is a Memorial Day. Let us thank God for the sacrifice that Jesus made on our behalf.
