The circumstances that brought the church to Anderson County were not pleasant - World War II and the atomic bomb project in Oak Ridge. Yet out of something so dark and uncertain, the Lord's church grew in a place that it had not previously been.

Clinton was the first to meet - on **February 7, 1943**. Oliver Springs and New York Avenue were soon to follow later in the year. Highland View began meeting in 1944. Lake City soon followed in 1945, Scarboro in 1947, and Claxton in 1951.
