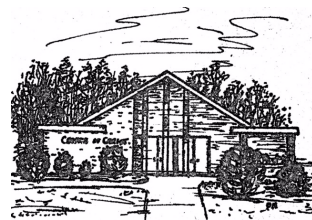

Our Resurrected Body

One of the difficulties of being raised in the church is the inability to grasp deeper concepts as a small child. Unfortunately, some of these concepts never develop in our minds which can weaken our spirituality. Furthermore, these deeper ideas demand us to take the initiative to consider them in their entirety for there to be any kind of internal growth. For the longest time I figured we'd transformed into these mystic orbs after we died to endlessly float around a heavenly realm with no direction or purpose.

I want to suggest a couple passages, as well as some narrative, to hopefully encourage you in the things concerning the heavenly realm. I believe there is great excitement and anticipation to be obtained when thinking of living with God forever. As a disclaimer, one must also keep in mind that the details of heaven are limited in scripture for a variety of reasons. It could very well be due to the fact that the eternal life and the heavenly abode can't be described adequately with words and is out of the grasp of comprehension. With that said, there are a few verses that will ignite a spark of excitement in our souls.

1. **A Personal Resurrection Is Worthy to Pursue** (Philippians 3:11) - Paul made it very clear in the Philippian letter that he longed for the day in which he'd be raised from the dead. Perhaps it was his close death drawing near that gave him such hope, or maybe it was the excitement of the future to be with Christ; either way, the life to come was counted as gain (1:21)
2. **A Personal Resurrection Is Warranted by Jesus** (Philippians 3:21) - This is the greatness of establishing your faith in a way that it becomes personal. In this passage, Paul tells of Jesus "transforming our lowly bodies to be like His glorious body." Consider the implications of such a statement. After Jesus' resurrection, He visited His disciples and even appeared to over 500 witnesses (1 Corinthians 15:5,6). Death no longer haunted the body of Jesus. We too, will have a transformation process at the resurrection.
3. **A Personal Resurrection Is Waiting** (1 John 3:2) - This is an event that will happen. It is not a matter of "if," but rather, "when." Often times we ask the question "are you ready for judgment day" in a negative sense, but I believe we can ask it in a positive light as well. John talks in harmony with his brother in Christ, Paul, in regards to the "appearing" of Jesus and what that implies for us as His followers.

There is without a doubt more details about this discussion that can be studied about in scripture. Admittedly, there are also many more details that are not brought up in scripture. Yet, the bottom-line remains; the resurrection of Jesus was a prelude for the resurrection of our own selves. Eternal life is not some random scene with a bunch of clouds and spiritual orbs floating around. Rather, it is a home where a Father can reunite with His children for eternity. There are many other questions that can be asked of this abode, but never let those questions distract from the glory and greatness of being with God forever.
