There is one thing I can't stand about mobile technology that rises well above all its other defects and deficiencies, and that is, the fact that if you don't have a constant power supply hooked up to your device, it will eventually die. Oh boy!!! Just thinking about a dead/dying battery drives me up the wall, because it always seems to happen when you have, not only forgotten your wall/car charger at home, but when you need your phone, tablet, or computer the most. I know you know what I am talking about; for we have all have "been there and done that." The truth is, while a dead smart device may be extremely annoying and problematic to us at times, it doesn't even begin to compare to the eternal consequences we can face if we allow our spiritual battery to die. However, before we jump right into ways we can go about recharging our spiritual batteries, we first need to find out exactly what our spiritual battery is.

Simply put, our spiritual battery is our willingness to be a devoted servant of Jesus, and just like every other battery in this world, it has to be recharged from time to time. You see, a battery is not a self-sustaining power in and of itself. That is why we must have ready accessibility to constant power because if we don't, our devices will eventually die. The same is true pertaining to our spiritual batteries. If we stay away from God and His word (our spiritual chargers) for too long, our spiritual batteries will die out, and we will cease to serve and follow Jesus.

Now, everybody and their dog, knows the many ways one can drain the life out of their physical batteries, for we all have played our favorite device for too long, texted too many messages, talked too many hours, or simply forgot to plug the device into its charger. However, I wonder how many of us know, or actually care, about the ways one can lose the charge to his/her own spiritual battery?

Christians are lights living in a world of darkness (Matt. 5:14-16). Actually, we are like flash lights. We are not the one true light, but we bring just enough light to someone in order to show them out of the domain of darkness and into the true light, Christ (Col. 1:13; 4:5-6). However, the more we battle darkness by spreading our light, the lower our charge becomes. That means, we have to go back to the original light/power supply for recharging in order to continue our mission (Eph. 4:15-16). Sometimes, physical ailments like a sickness, mental disorder, or fleshly injury, can cause our battery (our willingness to serve and follow Jesus) to run low. Other times, we can lose our charge because we are too busy living in the world, doing worldly things, instead of serving Christ (1 Tim. 6:11-ff.; 2 Tim. 2:3-4). Still, at times, we can lose our spiritual charge because we are tired physically (job, sport, family), emotionally (stress, concentration burn-out, passion fatique), and spiritually (tired from doing the Master's (continued inside)

work, battling the Dark One). However, most of the time, our zeal to serve Jesus runs low because we, like we do with our smart devices from time to time, didn't plug into our Charger. Or in other words, we turned our back on Jesus and His word (1 Tim. 1:18-19).

So, how do we go about ensuring that our spiritual battery remains charged at all times so that we can go on serving and following Jesus no matter what? We can do this by keeping our eves focused on Christ and on His areat love for us (Col. 3:1-4; Heb. 12:1-3, 12-15; Rom. 5:8). When we find our spiritual battery growing dim, that is, our want to serve and please the Lord, let us remember Jesus' love and dedication He had for us when He walked this earth, which is the same love and dedication He continues to have for us in Heaven. It is this selfless and humble example of Christ's that we need to follow with all of our hearts, so that when we are tempted to give up, we won't (Heb. 5:7; Matt. 26:39)! Also, we can turn to the Holy Word of God for comfort, support, and most importantly, recharging when our love for God grows weak (2 Tim. 3:14-17; 2 Pet. 1:3-15). Not only will it give us a "pick me up" as we read over the precious promises of God, but it will also help mature and encourage us to continue on in the Way (1 Pet. 5:6-11). And lastly, in order to ensure that our spiritual battery remains charged so that our willingness to serve Jesus does not weaken and ao "kaput," let us be willing to spend our day in open communication with our God (1 Thess. 5:17; Luke.18:1).

Yes, just like our earthly batteries need recharging, our spiritual batteries do as well. Actually, our spiritual batteries need it even more so, for the eternal consequences of neglecting to do so are most severe (Matt. 7:21-23). God has promised to help us overcome everything (Rom. 8:31-39). That means He can recharge any battery even if it is dead (in sin). However, we must choose to let Him! God, may we be willing to charge our spiritual batteries as much as do our earthly ones!
