Fellowship Hall Update

Things have moved very quickly in the past two weeks. We have received a quote from the builder who constructed the Rocky Top building. The elders have acted on this much more reasonable quote than others we had received.

We met with the builder this past week and he talked us through several questions we had. Before we can commence building several things must take place. Plans will be drawn by the builder and submitted to the city, permits will be required, and our site plan will be submitted also. All of this will take several weeks to complete.

Some other things will be happening in the meantime. The builder will place his order to the steel company for the structural part of the building and this will take approximately three weeks to arrive on site. A large pile of dirt will appear on the grass lot. This will be used to make the transition of the two parking lots less steep. This parking lot must be completed before construction can begin on the new building to allow us adequate parking during the build.

As for the building itself the inside layout will be much the same as the drawings that are on the back wall of the auditorium. The outside of the building will be slightly different from the drawings. Brick matching the old building will go up ten feet with other material used above them. The floor of the new building will be a bit lower than the existing building. This will keep the loss of parking to a minimum. A covered walkway will be constructed along the back of the new building to our existing building. This will have no steps just a slight slope.

We are also planning to make a sound room area using part of the foyer. It will have a window overlooking the auditorium. This will allow for more seating at the back which will help as our attendance numbers have increased. This is great! Please keep the building project in your prayers.

Chance or Opportunity

Does God give you chances, or does He provide opportunities? We sometimes treat those words as synonyms, but their meanings are quite different! Chance indicates something random, uncertain, even accidental – a roll of the dice, as it were. You have no way to influence the outcome.

Opportunity, by contrast, implies that you play a role in choosing a course of action. You may choose wisely or foolishly, but it remains your choice. It is neither random nor accidental.

Some things do, indeed, happen by chance. Solomon wrote by inspiration, "Time and chance happen to them all" (Ecclesiastes 9:11). Sometimes our plans don't work out no matter what we do. We didn't plan to become ill or be laid off from work, but it happened. Such is life.

But not everything is subject to chance. God can and does provide opportunities. Paul urged the Galatians to "do good to all" as they had opportunity (Galatians 6:10). He understood when material support from the church at Philippi was delayed: "You surely did care, but you lacked opportunity" (Philippians 4:10).

Our salvation depends not on chance, but on how we use the opportunity God has provided in Christ. Acts 14:27 refers to it as God opening "the door of faith." As one chooses whether to walk through an open door, so we choose whether to trust Jesus and obey His gospel. This is neither random nor accidental.

Your eternal destiny depends not on chance, but on what you choose to do with the opportunities God has given to you.
