Like Children

In our studies of Luke's Gospel, multiple interactions between Jesus and his closest disciples revealed that the disciples believed Jesus, as the Messiah, was appointed by God to establish a physical, earthly kingdom. In this kingdom, they believed Jesus would reign as king after delivering the Jewish people from Rome's power. Because of those beliefs, the disciples often found themselves focused on which of them would be the greatest in Jesus' kingdom. On one occasion, for example, James and John asked to be seated at Jesus' right and left in his kingdom, a clear request for power in any earthly kingdom (Mark 10:35-45).

Rather than beating around the bush, in Matthew 18 the disciples decide to ask Jesus directly about greatness in his kingdom. Matthew 18:1 tells us, "At that time the disciples came to Jesus, saying, 'Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?'" It is hard to know with certainty what they expected Jesus to say. Maybe they hoped he would say one of them was going to be the greatest in the kingdom. Maybe they expected Jesus to teach them how to achieve this earthly greatness they were seeking.

Regardless of their expectations, Jesus gave them an answer that would have left any first century man shocked: "And calling to him a child, he put him in the midst of them and said, 'Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven'" (18:2-3). In Jesus' culture, children were viewed near slaves at the bottom of the greatness totem pole. Jesus is clear here: Greatness in the kingdom of heaven is measured differently than earthly greatness.

True greatness is measured by one's trust in God. Undoubtedly, children are the world's most trusting individuals. Children cannot buy their own clothes, cook their own food, drive their own vehicles, or pay for their own groceries. Children must trust in someone greater than themselves. Jesus calls us to trust in the Lord as children trust in those who care for them. Proverbs 3:5 teaches us, "Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding."

True greatness is measured by one's humility. In Matthew 18, Jesus knew that he was answering a question posed out of arrogance. The disciples knew what greatness looked like in earthly kingdoms, and they were ready to do what it took to become great in Jesus'. Jesus answers their question, however, to bring them back down to earth. After Jesus tells them the impossibility of entering the kingdom of heaven without becoming like children, he then says, "Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven" (18:4).

True greatness in the kingdom of heaven is counter cultural. To be great in Christ's kingdom, he must become like children, living lives of humility and placing our full trust in our Lord. God loves you, and so do I.
