

The Love Problem

Hello friends and family,

Since many of us just observed Valentine's Day, let me invite you to think about something for a moment. If you were asked to write down the three things you love most in this world, what would make your list? Family, friends, and meaningful parts of life would surely be there — but would the Lord and His kingdom truly be among our highest loves?

The Bible teaches that the greatest command is not simply to obey, but to *love* — to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength (Mk. 12:30). This reminds us that our deepest spiritual struggle is often not just about what we do, but about what we love most. Jesus said, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matt. 6:21). Our time, our energy, and our sacrifices always reveal our true priorities.

We understand this in everyday life. Loving parents give sacrificially for their children. A faithful soldier gives everything for his country. In the same way, true biblical love is not merely a feeling — it is a self-giving, sacrificial commitment (Jn. 15:12-13).

When we look at the cross, we see the perfect picture of that love. "God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8). John 3:16 declares that love gives. First John 4:8 tells us that love is not just something God does — it is who He is.

This means the love described in 1 Corinthians 13 is more than an ideal to admire; it is the very character of God that He calls His people to reflect. Jesus said that our love for one another would be the identifying mark of His disciples (Jn. 13:34-35). If that is true, then we must be willing to pause and take our spiritual pulse: *Does my love for God and for others reflect the love that has been shown to me?*

If we find that our love needs to grow, Scripture shows us how to realign our hearts. We spend time with God in prayer (Eph. 6:18; Col. 4:2; 1 Thess. 5:17). We invest in fellowship and service to others (Rom. 12:3-21). We give without expecting anything in return (Lk. 6:35-36). We diligently study His Word and put it into practice (2 Tim. 2:15; Jas. 1:22).

But most importantly, we continually come back to the cross.

"In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son" (1 Jn. 4:9-10). So, from time to time, let us ask ourselves: *Where does God truly fall on my love list?* May we strive to love Him more than ourselves and never forget the sacrificial love that has been so fully revealed in Jesus Christ, the One in whom all things hold together (Col. 1:15-20).
